

Site C Employment by Month: April 2016

Since construction started in summer 2015, BC Hydro's Site C Clean Energy Project has created hundreds of jobs for British Columbians. In the coming months and years, thousands of additional jobs will be created as major contracts get underway for main civil works, turbines and generators, transmission and the generating station and spillways.

The table below shows the latest Site C employment numbers.¹ As with any construction project, the number of workers — and the proportion from any particular location — will vary month-to-month and also reflects the seasonal nature of construction work.

¹ Total employment numbers are indicative only as they do not capture indirect or induced employment. The Site C Project Area excludes work performed outside of B.C. (e.g., manufacturing).

² During the month of April, there were no workers on the Site C Project Area under the Temporary Foreign Worker Program. There were approximately 10 management and professional employees of the partner companies of Peace River Hydro Partners working under the federal International Mobility Program.

³ Site C Project Area includes the Site C dam site, transmission corridor, reservoir clearing area, public roadwork and office staff in the Peace River Regional District.
