RE: Site C Clean Energy Project – Heritage Resources Management Plan 2019 Annual Report (for the period January 1 to December 31, 2022)

I am writing to provide you with an annual update on BC Hydro's Heritage Resources Management Plan (HRMP) for 2022. This eighth update is being submitted in accordance with Condition 15.6 of the Site C Project's Decision Statement, issued to BC Hydro on October 14, 2014 (and revised on November 14, 2014), as well as with reporting required outlined in the HRMP.

Per Condition 15.6 of the Decision Statement:

The Proponent shall implement the plan and provide to the Agency an analysis and summary of the implementation of the [Heritage Resources Management Plan], as well as any amendments made to the plan in response to the results, on an annual basis during construction and for the first five years of operation, unless otherwise indicated.

This plan also provides an update on Condition 62 of the Environmental Assessment Certificate, which requires that BC Hydro "protect and preserve heritage resources by implementing measures as detailed in a Heritage Resources Management Plan." In addition, per Condition 9 of the HRMP, BC Hydro has committed to preparing and submitting an annual report to the BC Archaeology Branch, the Environmental Assessment Office (EAO), Indigenous groups including the Métis Nation British Columbia.

The HRMP was developed by BC Hydro, in consultation with Reservoir Area Indigenous groups and the Métis Nation British Columbia, to avoid, minimize or manage impacts to local archaeological and heritage resources. The draft HRMP was submitted to the Archaeology Branch of FLNR, Indigenous groups, and Métis Nation British Columbia on October 17, 2014. The final HRMP was submitted to EAO, the Archaeology Branch of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, Indigenous groups and Métis Nation British Columbia on June 5, 2015.

In response to a direction from the British Columbia Environmental Assessment Office, the HRMP was also updated and submitted to regulators, the Archaeology Branch and Indigenous groups and the Métis Nation British Columbia on November 19, 2018.

Heritage Resource Work in 2022

The heritage resources program for the Site C Project is a multi-year integrated study comprising assessments of palaeontological, archaeological and historical resources. The 2022 heritage program level of effort was reduced compared to that in previous years, largely due to reaching the milestone of completing archaeological inventory and impact assessment of the project area in 2021.

The palaeontological resources investigation and mitigation program was completed previously in 2019. In 2022, two palaeontological chance finds were reported which required follow up analysis.

The archaeological program entered its 13th year in 2022. Pre-construction archaeological impact assessments focused on new locations that required archaeological or heritage consideration. Systematic data recovery work did not occur this year due to avoidance of archaeological sites through project redesign, or because heritage permit requirements already had been met regarding the frequency with which newly discovered sites were selected for systematic data recovery. Project components with archaeological work included the reservoir; aggregate sources associated with the dam site; distribution line relocation and boat launch infrastructure associated with Highway 29 realignment, and work areas associated with the Wildlife and Vegetation Monitoring and Mitigation Program. In addition, heritage support was provided for Indigenous burial management and project construction. Future assessment will continue to focus on project design changes.

Our 2022 archaeological field season resulted in the following work:

- 1 new archaeological site recorded
- 4 previously recorded sites revisited
- 25 sites with post ground disturbance inspection and/or monitoring by the Heritage Specialist
- 12 sites with compliance support or inspection by the Heritage Specialist
- 1 archaeological chance find
